# Amendments to the ISM Code Effective From 01 July 2014


The ISM code (International Management Code) for the Safe Operation of Ships and for Pollution Prevention has been a cornerstone of maritime safety since its introduction in 1994. The purpose of ISM Code is to ensure Safety at Sea, to prevent human injury or loss of life, and to avoid damage to the environment and to the ship. The last amendment to the ISM code was made in July 2010.

Following the COSTA CONCORDIA marine accident, a working committee was assembled to assess whether the measures to promote and maintain a high safety level on ships, already identified at previous meetings, were sufficient. As a result, the Committee adopted amendments to the ISM Code. The overall purpose of the amendments is to stress the company's responsibility for assessing whether the crew is sufficient in relation to the ship's operation and to clarify the company's responsibility for ensuring that ISM related tasks that are delegated out to sub-suppliers meet the safety standards of the ISM Code. These amendments (Clause 6.2 amended and Clause 12.2 added) come into force on 01 July 2014. Click here to download MSC circular.

The Committee also agreed on a number of other measures that would, in the longer term, contribute to enhancing safety at sea on passenger ships, including for example new designs preventing the location of vital equipment in the same area and ensuring increased emergency power supply, including an extension of the emergency systems capable of being maintained from here.

QMII has already incorporated these changes to our maritime training.

Mr. David K. Smith is a consultant, instructor, and auditor with QMII. He retired from the US Coast Guard after more than 27 years enlisted and commissioned officer service. He served in a variety of special assignments, including military healthcare administration, officer personnel recruiting, and the marine safety program.

His last assignment while on active duty was as a Lieutenant Commander at the Coast Guard Headquarters, Office of Quality Assurance, Training and Inspection, in Washington, DC. In this assignment, he served as a Quality Management System -Lead Auditor. conducting process-based QMS audits and assisting with quality management system reviews.

His most notable achievement was the planning and hosting of International Maritime Standards Organization for Training. Certification and Watchkeeping (STCW) audit conducted by a delegation from Transport Canada, a first of its kind of a major audit of a Coast Guard operational program.

Mr. Smith is a RABQSA ISO 9001:2008 Quality Management Systems Lead Auditor with several years of auditing experience.
