

Transition to 9001:2015

The 2015 ISO 9001 is substantially different from the 2008 version. The revised standard has a new structure and new requirements. Top management (leadership), auditors and other practitioners of the system approach will benefit from understanding how these changes will affect their management systems.

The new HLS (High Level Structure) developed by ISO is a format and structure that reorganizes the outline of requirements with a new numbering system. The HLS has a common core structure, is based on universal definitions and will be used in all future standards.

The revised 9001:2015 standard has greater emphasis on risk-based thinking. The confusion between documents and records has been removed and there is greater flexibility with regard to use of documents. The standard also places greater focus toward adding value for the customer and the business.
